

John E. Hornberger, Lieutenant Colonel, USAR (Retired)



Lieutenant Colonel John Hornberger was born in Glens Falls, NY and graduated from SUNY Albany in 1987 with a BA. He is a graduate of the US Army Quartermaster Course, Engineer Officer Basic Course, Transportation Officer Advanced Course, Unit Movement Officer Course, Combined Arms Staff Service School and Command and General Staff College.

During a career of 22 years, Lieutenant Colonel Hornberger has served in numerous command and staff assignments. He has served as a Company Commander, as well as several Battalion, Group and Theater Support Command levels and has served in Europe and Southwest Asia.

Among his assignments were: Platoon Leader, Company B, 841ST Engineers, Commander, 495TH Transportation Company (MTP), Movement Control Officer, 49TH Movement Control Battalion (Iraq), Deputy Support OPS Officer, 1ST Theater Sustainment Command (Kuwait) and Commander, 387TH Theater Opening Element.

Lieutenant Colonel Hornberger was twice deployed to Southwest Asia in support of the Global War on Terror. As part of the 49TH Movement Control Battalion in Iraq (2004), he oversaw the movements of logistics convoys, planning supply routes and ensuring no Forward Operating Bases ran short of critical supplies. As Deputy SPO for 1ST Theater Sustainment Command in Kuwait, he supervised the timely and systematic delivery of critical logistics into Iraq, Afghanistan and the Horn of Africa.

Lieutenant Colonel Hornberger retired from the US Army Reserve in 2011. He lives in Bradenton with his wife, Karen, and their three children.
